
Bisexuality vs. Pansexuality May 2018-February 2019


Do you identify yourself as bisexual or pansexual?

(German, English speaking, together)



This survey shows:

German speakers call themselves way more often (only or mainly) bisexual: 80% vs. 50%. German speakers call themselves hardly (only or mainly) pansexual: 5% vs. 38%. Both labels fit somehow for 38% vs. 37%.



Clear Favourite:

"Everyone should call themselves what they want!"

English speakers are all more inclusive:

Bi-and pansexuals should cooperate here 84%, for German speakers only 64%, but that is still a clear majority!

<u>Prejudice or seeing of disadvantages</u> <u>is also higher for German speakers:</u>

Only 44% recognise that "bisexual" is not limited to 2 genders (English 69%). And 13% see discrimination through the label (English 2%).

The individual proposals include e.g.:

- More working together,
- Seeing more similarities rather than differences,
 - no definition of each other's identity,
 - joint activities, e.g. at prides,
 - Talking more to each other,
 - •"Shut up for once and listen!" ☺
